GORE HIGH SCHOOL TRAPSHOOTERS COMPETE AT THE SOUTHLAND CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Gore High No1 team of Michael Sutherland (57/60), Matt Paterson, (60/60), Mark Gow, (55/60), Jarrod Minty, (52/60), and Callum McLeod (55/60), retained the Jenkinson Cup and Alan White Sports trophy after having to shoot off against the John McGlashin College boys after initially being tied on (279/300). The Gore boys won the tense shoot off by 7 points.

From an individual perspective Matt Paterson's effort to win the Points Scoring Open High Gun was the days highlight. After being one of only two to shoot a possible (60/60) he had to shoot off against the younger up and coming 2010 New Zealand representative Cameron Meikle from Mount Aspiring College, but managed to dispatch him after 5 targets.

Michael Sutherland again shot well for the day and was unlucky not to pick up the High Gun for the Single Barrel competition after losing the shoot off. He finished 1st in the Senior Single Barrel, 3rd in the Senior Points scoring and 3rd in the Senior Skeet. Nathan Orr had a fantastic competition finishing 2nd in the Senior Single Rise (20/20) and (57/60) in points scoring and (9/10) in the Single Barrel. Bevan Ross had a great day at the office shooting his first possible in the Single Rise event (20/20) following it up with a (55/60) points scoring and (8/10) Single Barrel. He has a bright future in the sport as does the new boy Lachlan Johnstone who shot (18/20) Single Rise in his first ever competition shoot and after only having 5 practice rounds. The Cub is in good hands with these young shooters coming through as well as having Chris McIntyre and Reagan Dodds making progress.
